SECOND SESSION ON THE MIDDLE EAST CONFLICT TODAY

Recent armed conflict between Hamas and Israel has brought to the fore renewed questions about the State of Israel and the Palestinian territories. Questions such as: How did this all come to be? Why don't Palestinians just leave Israel alone? What is the reality actually like for Palestinians? Who is Hamas? What is Gaza and the West Bank? Hasn't this conflict been going on for centuries? And more. To work toward a true peace in the Holy Land, a fuller understanding is important that leads us beyond the simple good/bad dichotomy and that can help us avoid antisemitism and anti-arab sentiment as well as islamophobia.

Today, 3-6pm, the congregations of Altamont Reformed, Hamilton Union Presbyterian, Helderberg Reformed, and Lynnwood Reformed are invited to Lynnwood Reformed Church to learn more about the history of Israel/Palestine as well as more about what the reality of the situation looks like through

the lenses of two excellent documentaries. Each session will conclude with a discussion, and the second session will conclude with a Question & Answer with the Rev. John Paarlberg, retired RCA minister and regional coordinator for Churches for Middle East Peace.
